


The One and Only Ivan

And for the record, he definitely didn't earn this fate.

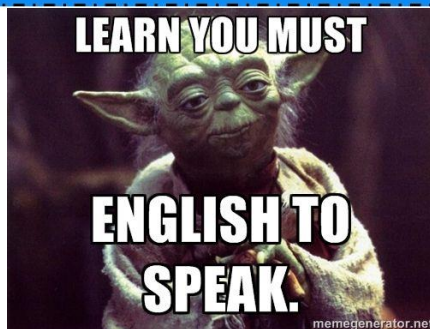

The Question-Answer Relationships

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The answer is usually located in one sentence and is EASY TO FIND. The reader will find some of the same words in the answer that are in the question. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The answer is located in more than one sentence or paragraph. The reader must PUT different parts of the text TOGETHER to find the answer. The information is stated in the text and the reader answers the question by PUTTING it TOGETHER. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The answer is IMPLIED and is not stated in the text. The reader must access PRIOR KNOWLEDGE OF INFORMATION provided by the author and make an inference. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The answer is not located in the text. The reader can even answer the question WITHOUT reading the text. You need to use your OWN EXPERIENCES to answer the questions.

to read "in between the lines" and figure out what the author is saying!

1. **QAR: Author and Me.** What does Ivan mean when he says, "In my size humans see a test of themselves." (how I look - line 17). Our invisible classmate, Barb Dwyer wrote her answer to this question, so you could see an example of an answer using RAPP and CUPS. This is QAR - Author and Me, so you get a clue from the text (Ivan's quotation). That's the **AUTHOR'S** part. You need to think about what you already know about humans who hunt gorillas or other huge animals to kill or capture. That's the **ME** part. Then, **CONNECT** the two sets of information (text and your experience with the topic) to draw a conclusion. Here is Barb's answer:

(R): When Ivan says, "in my size humans see a test of themselves," I think he means **(A):** that humans look at his huge size and see him as an animal that is a challenging contest for man to overpower and conquer. Ivan is four hundred pounds of pure gorilla power. It would mean something to capture this creature. **(P):** I know that people have animal heads and whole animals stuffed to keep as trophies. I know huge and powerful animals like gorillas and elephants are kept in cages so people pay money to see them. That's why I think Ivan said that he was a test for humans because of his gigantic size. **(P):** CUPS correct.



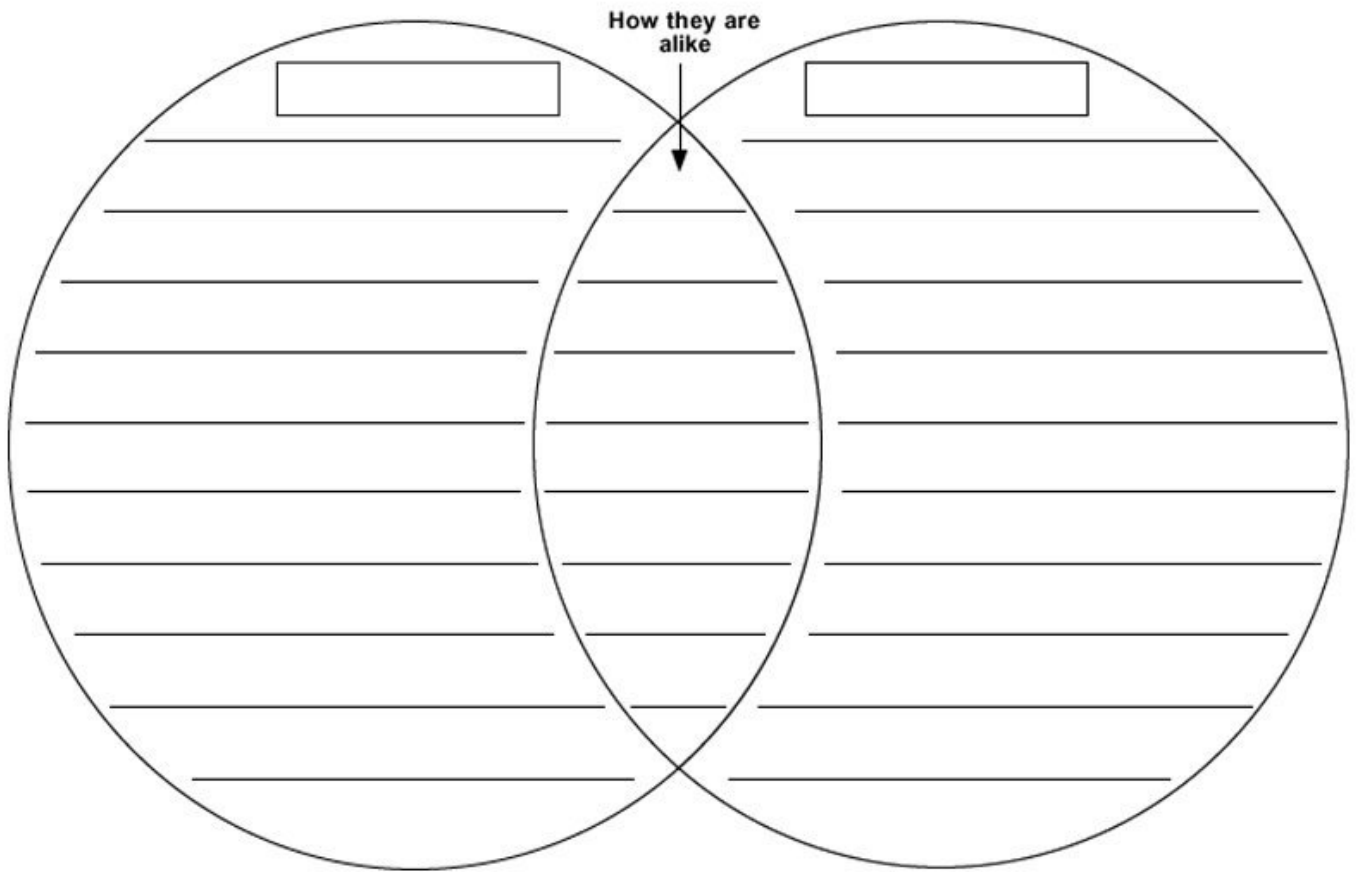

Venn Diagram (Character)

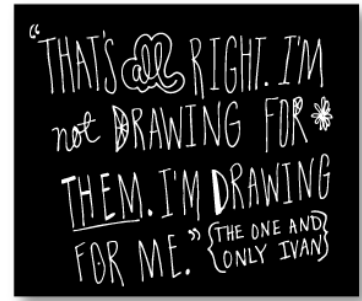
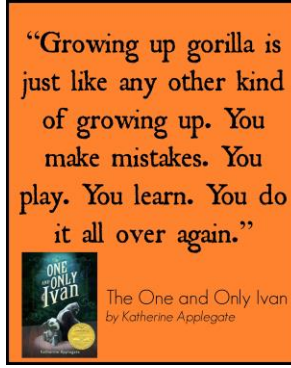

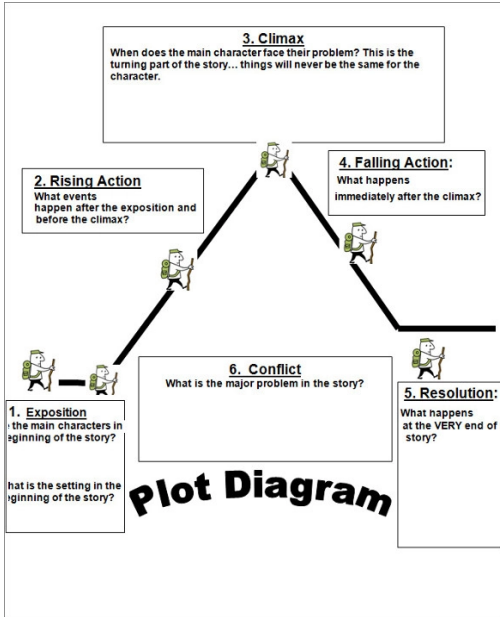
